
Future Activity:


All good intentions but things didn't happen. Still on my to do list:

- Contact Schools Sports Partnership and initiate a plan for a model of working with a cluster of primary schools with their support




"Schools" is where year 6 students not currently affiliated to a club attend at the end of the season.

U14 National League:

The high point was 4 Cambridge Teams entering. The low point was that some teams pulled out of some matches, which left clubs without games. This also presents a problem of how to reimburse those teams who were able to field teams but didn't get a match, and were therefore unable to charge the children, leaving them out of pocket. We need to take this in to account and issue refunds to those teams who did not default in future seasons when we were able to cancel the hall.

Referees continue to be a strain for this competition. I will try to get non-Cambridge teams to bring referees where they can, but this is quite difficult. Every Cambridge club that has entered should aim to provide a referee to cover two games per event.
